

FACILITIES, FACULTY & HISTORY

Facilities:

N.E.W. Lutheran High School is located on the East side of Green Bay, (southeast of East Towne Mall and across from Wilder Park) at 1311 S. Robinson Avenue. The facilities measure over 29,000 square feet and includes classrooms, a gymnasium, cafeteria, computer lab, science lab, music room, locker rooms and weight rooms. Outside the school on the 13.7 acres of land is a soccer field and baseball/softball diamonds. The land abuts a Green Bay conservancy area, where with cooperation from the city of Green Bay this has been designated a 17-acre school forest for outdoor classroom use.

Faculty:

There are currently 15 staff members: Seven full-time teachers, two part-time teachers, one Executive Director/teacher, one Athletic Director/teacher, one Career Guidance Counselor/teacher, a bookkeeper, one office staff and two parent office staffers. All faculty members hold Bachelor's degrees, while 2 hold advanced degrees and most have a Wisconsin DPI teaching license. Eight teachers have over 10 years of experience in the teaching ministry.

History:

N.E.W. Lutheran High School was incorporated in 1976 and began classes in 1977. The school's first location was at Pilgrim Lutheran Church until 1981. The school then occupied the old Norwood School on 9th Street until 1989, when it moved again and shared space at the former Premontre High School. When Notre Dame Academy came into existence at the Premontre site, the school transferred over to the old St. Joseph Academy, and stayed there until 1993 when the current facility was constructed. The school is supported by thirteen Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) association churches – Celebration Lutheran, Appleton; Christ of the Bay Lutheran, Green Bay; Faith Lutheran, Green Bay; Hope Lutheran, De Pere; Our Saviour Lutheran, Green Bay; Pilgrim Lutheran, Green Bay; Redeemer Lutheran, Green Bay; St. John Lutheran, Luxemburg; St. John Lutheran, Pulaski; St. Paul Lutheran, Montpelier; Zion Lutheran, Oconto; Zion Lutheran, Oneida; and Zion Lutheran, Wayside.
