Graduation Requirements: Additional Notes

Twenty-six (26) credits are required for earning a high school diploma. The following courses and credits are required:

4 Credits of English
3 Credits of Social Studies (incl. one semester of Economics)
3 Credits of Science
3 Credits of Mathematics
2 Credits of Physical Ed/Health
.5 Credits of Microsoft Office
.5 Credits of Fine Arts
.5 Credits of Personal Finance
16.5 Required Credits

Accounting is offered every other year. This is offered when graduating year is even: 2027-2028, 2029-2030, etc.

Fantasy Literature is offered every other year. It will be offered again Fall 2026.

Mythology & Folklore is offered every other year. It will be offered again Fall 2027.

Drama Speech is offered every other year depending on interest.

Drafting is not offered every year.

Physical Education

Senior students may waive .5 credits of the physical education requirement if both of the following conditions are satisfied:

1. The student will have completed six seasons of interscholastic athletics prior to senior year.
2. The student will participate in at least two interscholastic athletics during senior year.

Dual Credit Opportunities and Details

PreCalc: If taking PreCalc for dual enrollment through UWGB, students must earn a B or higher to earn UWGB credit.

Statistics: If taking Statistics for dual enrollment through UWGB, students must earn a B or higher to earn UWGB credit.

Calculus: If taking Calculus for dual enrollment, students must earn a C or higher in MATH 104 or pass the UWGB placement exam.

Anatomy: May be eligible for dual credit. Please discuss with the principal.

Introduction to Business: May be eligible for dual credit. Please discuss with the principal.

Students are encouraged to meet with the Principal to explore additional opportunities for dual credit.
