Rules for Foreign Exchange/International Students and Parents

- Students are expected to comply with all school rules as outlined in the student handbook.
- School attendance is mandatory and is a requirement of maintaining F-1 visa status
- Drinking of alcoholic beverages and the use of illegal drugs are prohibited. A description and listing of all prescription medications must be provided to the host family and NEWLHS upon arrival.
- Driving of automobiles or any motorized vehicle must comply with laws of the State of Wisconsin and the United States. Per Admission Requirements for International Students, students under the age of 18 may NOT take driver's education or drive a motorized vehicle.
- Students must comply with all host family regulations (curfews, chores, computer usage, family meals, etc.). First, students and host families are encouraged to resolve disagreements with each other. Any unsatisfactorily resolved dispute should be brought to the attention of the NEWLHS Career Guidance Director.
- While enrolled as an I-20 student at NEWLHS, all students are under the jurisdiction of local, state, and federal laws and must obey all governmental laws, including those regarding immigration status.
- Students are not permitted to travel independently during their enrollment. Travel is only permitted if accompanied by an approved adult or with an organized group. School approval must be obtained if the trip takes place during school sessions. Approval may also be required by the student's natural parents, host parents and the NEWLHS PDSO.

Violation of the above rules and others posted in other documents or programs may result in the immediate dismissal of the student from the program.

Northeastern Wisconsin Lutheran High School also reserves the right to terminate a student's F-1 visa status if the student's physical or mental health is deemed to be at risk, as determined by NEWLHS.
